- ➤ There were 828,138 franchised business establishments in the United States in 2007.
- Franchised businesses provided 9,125,700 jobs, or 6.2 percent of the U.S. private nonfarm workforce in 2007.
- Franchised businesses supplied an annual payroll of \$304.4 billion, or 4.2 percent of all private nonfarm payrolls in the United States in 2007.
- Franchised businesses produced goods and services worth \$802.2 billion, or 3.4 percent of private nonfarm output in the United States in 2007.
- ➤ Franchised businesses contributed \$468.5 billion to GDP, or 3.9 percent of all private nonfarm GDP in the United States in 2007.
- ➤ We include in "franchised businesses" all those establishments that are part of a franchise system those businesses owned by franchisees and those owned by franchisors.

- ➤ Franchised businesses demand products and services from other businesses and provide income to their workers and owners, who then spend their income and create still more income for other parties. As this cycle repeats, the jobs, payroll, output, and contribution to GDP that exist *because of* franchised businesses grow beyond the jobs, payroll output, and contribution to GDP that are *in* franchised businesses alone.
- > Franchised businesses were the cause of over 17 million jobs, or 11.8 percent of all U.S. private nonfarm employment in 2007.
- ➤ Franchised businesses were the cause of \$707.6 billion of annual payrolls, or 9.7 percent of all private nonfarm payrolls in the United States in 2007.
- ➤ Franchised businesses were the cause of \$2.1 trillion of annual output, or 9.0 percent of all private nonfarm output in the United States in 2007.
- ➤ Franchised businesses were the cause of \$1.2 trillion in GDP, or 9.7 percent of all private nonfarm GDP in the United States in 2007.

- ➤ Business format franchising accounted for 788,285 establishments and product distribution franchising accounted for an additional 39,853 establishments in the United States in 2007.
- > Business format franchising provided 7.8 million jobs in 2007, or more than five times as many as product distribution franchising.
- **▶** Business format franchising was the cause of 14.5 million private nonfarm jobs in the United States.
- ➤ Product distribution franchising was the cause of 3.0 million private nonfarm jobs in the United States.

- ➤ Business format franchising was economically significant in 10 lines of business.
- > In total, and in every line of business, there were more establishments that are owned by franchisees than by franchisors.
- ➤ Quick Service Restaurants accounted for more establishments and jobs and produced greater output and contributed more to GDP than any other single business format line of business. Only Business Services met a greater payroll.
- ➤ Franchised Quick Service Restaurants accounted for 68.5 percent of all jobs in the Quick Service Restaurant line of business. This was the largest percentage of franchised jobs within any business format line of business.
